




About EHP

Environmental Health Perspectives (EHP) is published with support from the U.S. National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences (NIEHS) as a fully independent peer-reviewed scientific journal. *EHP* serves as a forum for the discussion of the interrelationships between the environment and human health by publishing high-quality research and news of the field. The journal supports global environmental health research through its policy of full open access and commitment to dissemination of research and information to the developing world.

EHP Chinese Edition

EHP Chinese Edition is made up of news articles first published in *EHP*. Each issue also includes original or reprinted editorials, and occasional commentaries and review articles. *EHP* has teamed up with the Shanghai Municipal Center for Disease Control and Prevention to distribute *EHP Chinese Edition* to subscribers in China, Taiwan, Hong Kong, and Singapore.

Journal Partnerships

International journal partnerships foster scientific exchange and further the shared scientific goals and missions of each partner through wider dissemination of scientific information to new audiences. *EHP* currently maintains partnerships with five journals:

Journal of Environmental and Occupational Medicine is a bimonthly environmental and occupational health journal published by the Shanghai Municipal Center for Disease Control and Prevention, China.

Salud Pública de México is a peer-reviewed public health journal published bimonthly by the National Institute of Public Health, Mexico. *Salud Pública de México* publishes Spanish translations of selected *EHP* News articles.

Mali Médical is a quarterly medical journal published in Mali by the Société de Médecine du Mali. This partnership is a result of the African Journal Partnership Project.

Annales Africaines de Médecine is a quarterly medical journal published in DR Congo by the Université de Kinshasa Faculté de Médecine. This partnership is a result of the African Journal Partnership Project.

Environnement, Risques et Santé is a cross-disciplinary French journal publishing articles on health issues relevant to climatology, toxicology, epidemiology, biophysics, earth and water sciences, and radiation.

African Journal Partnership Project

The African Journal Partnership Project was launched in 2004. This project, which now includes six international journals (including *EHP*) and nine African journals, seeks to:

- develop a program to strengthen African medical journals such that they can provide training for African medical researchers,
- improve the quality and visibility of these journals, and
- make the journals a better resource for local researchers and policy makers.

The project has achieved notable success in meeting these goals. Most of the journals are now indexed in MEDLINE, and the provision of technical equipment has allowed the journals to become more efficient and resulted in improvements in processing times and journal management. Performance indicators show that submissions have increased and the regularity of publication has improved. Each of the African partner editors has conducted a series of successful training workshops for authors and reviewers. By incorporating a training element for local facilitators, these workshops are now becoming sustainable regular events.
